

Keep 911 Available for Emergencies

If there is an immediate threat to life or property, CONTACT 911.

If you have a non-emergency, such as the examples listed on the other side, please use the number shown below for your area.



911 Tips

- If you contact 911 by mistake, stay on the line. Let the dispatcher know there is no emergency.
- Know your location! 911 services may not automatically know your location.

How to Report a Non-emergency in Snohomish County

- 1 If there is an immediate threat to life or property, CONTACT 911.
- 2 For non-emergencies such as the examples listed below . . .
 - In SOUTHWEST Snohomish County, dial **425-775-3000** (www.snocom.org) (see map on back)
 - In the rest of Snohomish County, dial **425-407-3999** (www.snopac911.us)

Examples of non-emergencies include:

- Illegal fireworks complaint
- A crime that occurred earlier and there is no suspect information
- A found pet or property item
- A situation where emergency services personnel are needed, but there is no immediate danger to life or property
